Hurunui District Council Case Story #18

Background

Hurunui district has a large geographical spread, with coastlines on the east and high country to the west. There are three area schools located in Cheviot, Culverden and Hawarden. Area schools offer primary, intermediate and secondary education in one school. Along with our primary schools offering intermediate education we have a number of young people who travel to Rangiora or Christchurch for schooling.

A lack of public transport makes it difficult to get around the district and to meet other young people. In the past the Hurunui Youth Programme have run formals for students, since 2023 the Hurunui Youth Council (HYC) have taken on this event following feedback from the young people.

2024 Formals

After the success of the 2023 formals the Hurunui Youth Council formals are back for a second year. They took place over two evenings: Year 7 and 8 students celebrated on Friday, while Year 9 and 10 students enjoyed their event on Saturday, both were held in Hanmer Springs. A total of 181 young people attended the formals, and the feedback has been overwhelmingly positive.





These events are highly anticipated by young people across Hurunui each year, providing them with opportunities to connect, meet, and socialise with other young people from the region. The nights unite students from Hurunui schools, those who are home-schooled, distance learners, and even students that school outside of the district and it is super exciting to see the friendships ignited at the events.

Challenges

Location: HYC conducted social media polls and asked students which location was their preference. Hanmer Springs was the resounding winner. **Transport:** two buses were funded by Ministry of Youth Development to bring students to Hanmer Springs. One left from Amberley and went up the west side of the district. The other left from Cheviot and brought students from the east and those from the Waiau area.

Outcomes

This youth-led event is created, organised, and executed by members of the Hurunui Youth Council, with assistance from the Hurunui Youth Programme Leaders. Council staff were there in a support capacity.
