Our three priorities

We aim to reduce drug related harm, poor mental health, and rising levels of poverty within our district and enhance the wellbeing of our communities.

Our objectives are:

- **01** Improve access of food provision and information/ education through our Snack Food in Schools and Mainpower Pantry projects.
- **02** Minimise drug related harm in the Hurunui through community education workshops and engagement.
- **03** Improve health and wellbeing for residents of the Hurunui district through the Next Steps Website, the slice of wellbeing project and an online campaign over Mental Health Awareness Week.

Related Projects

Snack food in Schools

Provides eight Hurunui schools with lunch box tops ups for school staff to pass on to hungry students.

Mainpower Pantry

Supplies three Hurunui schools with a freezer filled with family meals and nutritious lunch options for students and their families.

Slice of Wellbeing

Our wellbeing packs are filled with useful wellbeing resources and distributed throughout our rural community via our vet clinics and local Police.
