Decision No. 57/OFF/484/2021

of an application by Amberley Hotel (2021) Limited for an off-licence pursuant to s.99 of the Act in respect of premises situated at 84 Carters Road, Amberley known as “Amberley Hotel”

DECISION (ON THE PAPERS)

This is an application by Amberley Hotel (2021) Limited for an off-licence in respect of premises situated at 84 Carters Road, Amberley, known as “Amberley Hotel”.

The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of a Hotel/Tavern with the hours authorised for the sale of alcohol between **Monday to Sunday from 7.00am to 10.00pm.**

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received.

In their reports, the Police, Medical Officer of Health, and District Licensing Inspector have raised no matters in opposition to this application.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s. 105 of the Act. However, we will issue the off-licence, once the following matters have been finalised:

- The Fire Evacuation Scheme be approved and signed off by Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ); and
- The Building Code of Compliance Certificate is issued for completion of earthquake strengthening and renovations of the premises.

The Off-licence will be issued once the Fire Evacuation Scheme has been signed off and Building Code of Compliance has been issued, authorising the sale and supply of alcohol, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply alcohol free, as a sample for consumption on the premises.

Requirements on holders of off-licences

The applicant's attention is drawn to ss. 56 and 57 of the Act obliging the holder of an off-licence to display:

- (1) A sign attached to the exterior of the premises, so as to be easily read by persons outside each principal entrance, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol; AND
- (2) A copy of the licence, together with a statement of all conditions subject to which it is issued, attached to the inside of the premises so as to be easily read by people entering each principal entrance.

Additional conditions

An additional condition has been included in the Off-Licence relating to the single sales of RTD's and mainstream beer: *single sales of craft beers are permitted but there shall be no single sales of RTDs or mainstream beer, except as a result of broken packaging.*
